Previous Meeting - Therapy dogs

It was a delight to welcome Gill McCartney and her therapy Dog, Maggie, to our meeting.

Having seen the beneficial impact that Maggie had on some of the residents at a care home, Gill joined the charity 'Therapy Dogs Nationwide'. Gill and Maggie have become regular visitors at a care home with dementia patients, a sheltered housing complex and a primary school (where children are given the opportunity to read to Maggie!). The intention is to provide comfort, distraction and stimulation to children and adults alike. While Gill was explaining this Maggie was quite happy to sit, have her tummy tickled and generally stay calm.

Gill ended her presentation by describing the benefits of 'Animal Assisted Therapies' ranging from improvement in general health and wellbeing, increased confidence levels, improved and and controlled movement to improved communication skills. She also mentioned that therapy dogs are often used in the TV/film industry where a good temperament is needed.
